Dear Mr. Huggins,

This is to thank you for your letter of the 17th instant.

Let me begin by saying that, as it says in the introduction, it is not my object to prove whether golf originated in Scotland or Holland because it is impossible to prove the absence of it in either country before a given date. All I have been trying to do is to gather the positive facts which can be substantiated by evidence, because I was getting somewhat tired of all the "might have been's" which seem to lead a long and airy-fairy life!

I am sorry to have missed you when I was in Scotland in September. I had my collection of illustrative material along and the pictures in the articles in the Dutch Golf Monthly is but a small selection made by the editor of that paper. I am almost convinced that you might wish to select other pictures than those with the Dutch articles. There is a problem, however. I have but one collection of pictures and documents, some of which were very hard to come by. I am not very keen on sending you this book through the mail. Mail being what it is today, it might easily get lost.

In the first week of February I will be staying in London, and if you should happen to be there at that time I could take it along and let you have a look at it.

If you wish to use part of the historical material, and I can well understand your not using all of it, I would agree to your doing so on one condition. The condition being that the publication would not break the historical trend which it has given me such a lot of work to build up. I would therefore have to ask you to let me have the article(s) before publication which would in that case be subject to my prior approval. I have no doubt that you can improve on my English!

I have not yet taken steps to place the material elsewhere, chiefly because there is no hurry to do so. The only periodical in which the material will be published in full is the Golf Collectors Society Bulletin. You may not even have heard of the existence of it, since the society is a very small although international body. This publication is under reservation of all the copyrights. I am almost convinced that not more than - say - 10 of your readers would read the "Bulletin". (This publication is moreover without any illustrations).
