Due to business commitments, I was unable to be at the Autumn meeting this year when we might have met. However, I felt it appropriate to layout the details of an edition of Strokesaver for Kennemer Golf and Country Club.

You explained that you would only be interested in a relatively small quantity, and this of course means high unit costs, particularly if advertising is not acceptable.

We would suggest a format similar to Royal Troon, ie 40 pages inclusive of advertisements, and inclusive of clear plastic cover.

Quantity:- 2000 - Price £3.75 each approximately Quantity:- 5000 - Price £1.50 each approximately

In UK, Strokesaver sells at £1.50 each; I suggest you would retail at a higher price.

Should you wish to dispense with adverts and reduce the edition to 28 pages, the costs would rise dramatically.

Quantity:- 2000 - Price £6.75 each approximately Quantity:- 5000 - Price £2.90 each approximately

The production of editions takes 6-8 months depending on the time of the year. The on-course survey work 4-5 days.
