NOTES.

The Course. There is nothing to add to what has been said under this head at the last Annual General Meeting, although it may be agreed that the condition of the Course has materially improved during the past year. Under the supervision of one of your Committee Mr. G. H. Hanman, a ditch or trench close to the hedge from a point behind the 4th. Green, to the corner of the opening approaching the 7th. Green has been made therby defining the out of bounds line at this point. As you are aware there is every liklihood that a considerable portion of the Course will be taken away from us by the Railway Company for extension purposes and although no definate arrangement has so far been received as to how much ground they are likely to acquire, your Committee deemed it prudent in view of these circumstances to expend as little money as possible on the improvement of the Course pending definate arrangements with the Railway Company. The matter is still under negotiation and it is to be hoped that we will be able to keep the Course intact, or if not be fully compensated for any ground that may be taken from us.

COMPETITIONS.

Your present Committee after due consideration have decided to suggest alterations to the list of competitions hitherto played. As you are aware the Club is practically a week-end one and as such it has been found impossible to carry out the number of competitions down for play during the year. We therefore lay the following suggestions before you for your consideration:

(1) In place of "Monthly", "Quarterly Medals" i. e. A Silver Medal to be played for every three months.

Conditions 18 holes Medal play under Handicap — the winner of each Competition to receive a small silver medal.

(2) AGGREGATE GOLD MEDAL.

The player returning the best aggregate net scores in the above four Competitions to receive a Gold Medal.

N.B. In the event of there being no player returning all four cards, no medal to be presented but the award should prove a stimulus to Members to return cards.

(3) CHAMPIONSHIP.

Conditions. 18 Holes Medal play. The player returning the lowest actual card to be the winner and as in former years to hold the championship cup for a year and receive a replica of same. The player returning the lowest net score to receive a Club prize.

N.B. This competition is intended as a substitute for the present Club Championship.

(4) PRESIDENT'S CUP.

Conditions. Match Play, under handicap.

(5) CAPTAIN'S CUP.

Conditions. Match Play, under handicap.

N.B. The Club however should give a small prize to the runners up in both these competitions.

(6) FOURSOME COMPETITION.

Conditions. Match Play, under handicap Winners and Runners up to receive Club prizes.

- (7) If opportunity permits a Bogie Competition might be arranged and a special prize presented.
